Developing a cadre of professionals

UNISDR's Office for Northeast Asia and Global Education Training Institute (GETI) was established in 2010 to develop a new cadre of professionals in DRR and climate change adaptation for disaster resilient societies.

In 2014 (to the end of July), GETI had facilitated resilience action planning at nine forums in Armenia, India, Mongolia, Philippines, Qatar, and Republic of Korea, for more than 500 city and national DRR practitioners and policymakers from more than 26 countries. GETI partners with city and national partners in its work which also aims to strengthen country training institutes to take over future capacity building support.

The UN World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction, in March 2015, in Japan, is set to produce a Post-2015 successor to the Hyogo Framework for Action that identifies city and national level capacity building as crucial to future efforts to build resilience.

GETI's two main partners are the Korean National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) and the City of Incheon municipality, which hosts the Institute. GETI also works with national governments, city authorities, national training institutes, development agencies, international organisations, and sister UN organisations to deliver on its capacity building mandate.
