ACCRÉDITATION DES ORGANISATIONS NON GOUVERNEMENTALES ET DES AUTRES GRANDS GROUPES AU PROCESSUS PRÉPARATOIRE DE LA CONFÉRENCE MONDIALE SUR LA PRÉVENTION DES CATASTROPHES

Note du secrétariat

À sa première session, le Comité préparatoire a adopté les arrangements proposés pour l'accréditation et la participation au processus préparatoire et à la Conférence mondiale. Le secrétariat de la Conférence a reçu des demandes d'accréditation émanant d'ONG et d'autres grands groupes et a formulé des recommandations au Comité préparatoire pour adoption.

- 1. Dans sa résolution A/RES/58/214, l'Assemblée générale a encouragé les grands groupes visés dans Action 21 à contribuer de manière effective à la Conférence mondiale sur la prévention des catastrophes ainsi qu'à ses préparatifs et les a invités à se faire accréditer à cet effet.
- 2. Au cours de sa première session, le Comité préparatoire a adopté les procédures et critères d'accréditation qui figurent dans le document intitulé «Suggested arrangements for accreditation and participation in the preparatory process and in the World Conference on Disaster Reduction of relevant non-governmental organizations and other major groups» (A/CONF.206/PC(I)/INF.1).

- 3. Les organisations non gouvernementales et autres grands groupes qui n'appartiennent pas à l'une des catégories retenues¹, mais qui souhaitent participer à la Conférence et contribuer à son processus préparatoire peuvent se faire accréditer auprès du secrétariat de la Conférence en communiquant les renseignements mentionnés dans le document A/CONF.206/PC(I)/INF.1. Cette accréditation ne sera valable que pour le processus préparatoire et la Conférence mondiale sur la prévention des catastrophes.
- 4. Le secrétariat de la Conférence jugera, avec l'aide du service de liaison avec les organisations non gouvernementales de l'ONU et d'autres instances compétentes, le cas échéant, de la pertinence des activités des requérants sur la base des renseignements fournis et de leur participation à des activités de développement durable, en particulier dans les domaines liés à la prévention des catastrophes. Si l'évaluation permet d'établir, sur la base des renseignements fournis, que l'organisation requérante est compétente et que ses activités ont trait aux travaux de la Conférence, le secrétariat fera une recommandation favorable au Comité préparatoire, à qui appartient la décision d'accréditer les organisations non gouvernementales et autres grands groupes. Dans le cas contraire, le secrétariat de la Conférence fera part au Comité préparatoire des raisons de son refus. Le secrétariat de la Conférence présentera ses recommandations au Comité préparatoire deux semaines avant le début de la deuxième session du Comité. Toute organisation non gouvernementale ou tout autre grand groupe qui aura été accrédité pour prendre part à une session du Comité préparatoire pourra participer à toutes ses sessions ultérieures et à la Conférence elle-même.
- 5. Le secrétariat de la Conférence a évalué les demandes d'accréditation qu'il avait reçues au 31 août 2004, date limite pour le dépôt des demandes, et les soumettra, pour examen, au Comité préparatoire à sa deuxième session. La liste des organisations non gouvernementales et autres grands groupes recommandés par le secrétariat de la Conférence figure en annexe. En l'occurrence, le secrétariat a recommandé l'accréditation de toutes les organisations qui en avaient fait la demande. Si le secrétariat décidait ultérieurement de ne pas recommander l'accréditation d'une organisation, il s'en expliquerait dans un additif. Les demandes tardives ou incomplètes ne sont pas incluses dans le présent document.
