Report	<p>Ten years have passed since the Hyogoken-Nambu Earthquake (the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake Disaster) which is the greatest earthquake disaster among those struck Japan after the Second World War. It gave a strong impact to the Japanese architectural society which has contributed to building construction and urban development for safe and sustainable built environments.</p> <p>The Architectural Institute of Japan (AIJ), which is a professional institution of architects and building engineers, has seriously recognized this disaster as an important lesson and carried out academic surveys, analyses and studies from various aspects in order to establish the comprehensive earthquake disaster mitigation research.</p> <p>In this seminar, AIJ verifies the progress of the research over the past decade, extracts solved and unsolved problems from the research, and discusses what should be done before the next great earthquake strikes with the participants.</p>
