- ▲ System of certification and re-certification of training programmes including continuing professional education established & implemented;



PROPOSED INDICATORS

- ▲ Health emergency management courses incorporated in the curriculum and taught in all medical and paramedical professions;
- ▲ Information system established, functional and readily accessible by stakeholders;
- ▲ **T**en percent (10%) of the Ministry of Health budget utilized for funding and budgetary arrangements for operational costs for training and development;
- ▲ Strategic research agenda established, implemented and completed/published.
