- Relief materials (drugs to prevent the spread of infectious diseases) sent from Hyogo Prefecture

# Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake

Size of earthquake: Magnitude 7.3 Maximum seismic intensity: 7 on the seismic scale

Epicenter: Southern Hyogo Prefecture (northern Awaji Island) Casualties: 6,433 people Damage: ¥9.9 trillion Maximum evacuees: 316,678 people Maximum No. of evacuation centers: 1,153 facilities

Buildings damaged: 512,882 buildings

# General Verification and Recommendations in the 10th Year of Reconstruction If the second second

- The Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake Reconstruction Fund raised ¥900 billion and engaged in voluntary projects worth ¥365 billion
- The Law to Assist the Rebuilding of Lives in Disaster Areas was formulated and enhanced
- Two-stage urban plan was implemented to adjust land use and zoning in reconstruction areas
- Victims Reconstruction Support Conference was organized and convened
- Elderly/collective housing was built



- Support was provided for voluntary activities by
- prefectural residents
- Assistance was provided to community businesses etc.
- Wide-area stockpiles, fire-fighting schools and human resources training centers were established and enhanced
- Disaster Reduction and Human Renovation Institution was established
- International disaster-preparedness institutions were gathered in the New City Center in eastern Kobe
- Psychological care programs were put in place and the Hyogo Institute for Traumatic Stress was opened

### 

- A disaster emergency medical treatment system was established: the Hyogo Emergency Medical Center was opened
- Teachers were assigned to oversee education reconstruction, and "New Disaster-Preparedness Education" was promoted
- —Environment and Disaster-Preparedness Department established It Maiko Prefectural High School—
  - Programs were established to monitor the elderly affected by the disaster (LSA, SCS) and assist them in achieving independence
- Programs were implemented by residents, community groups, NGOs/NPOs, companies and government organizations

Disaster-preparedness education in primary

(elementary and junior high) education

(Evacuation drills, supplementary readers etc.)

Higher level disaster-preparedness education in prefectural high schools

(Disaster-preparedness education from the rspective of natural and social environment )

Creation of disaster-preparedness supplementary readers and improvement of teacher quality

Promote disaster-preparedness training in local communities




