- Translate DRM concepts into appropriate language for dissemination beyond technocrats
- Program planning and preparatory assistance phases



Recommendations to UNDP

- Harmonize DRM programming with UNDP core development business
- Explore rights based approach
- Place national disaster reduction advisors in highly disaster prone countries
- Revisit resource mobilization strategy for long-term capacity building programmes
- Improve institutional memory and documentation of DRM initiatives to facilitate analysis of lessons learned
