In depth exchange of experience over time

## Differences Between 'Case Station' and 'Case Study'

Case studies are seldom longitudinal

 Case studies have tended to be isolated from each other

#### Implications of the Field Campus

Case stations must be stable

Case stations must be visible

Case stations must be adaptable

### Benefits of the Field Campus

- Training of young professionals is more realistic and rigorous.
- There are simultaneous (or cascading) benefits for the host community or hinterland of the case study station.
- Knowledge exchange is face to face, which enhances electronic networking and provides for serendipity and surprise.
