Risk reduction pays off in Viet Nam

Viet Nam Red Cross Mangrove DP program

- 4 typhoons lash the Viet Nam coast every year
- Red Cross has helped villagers to replant 110 kilometres of coastal mangrove forests
- No loss of life & limited damage when Typhoon Wukong hit north in October 2000
 - Cost/saving: US\$1 million to plant & protect mangroves.
 Dyke maintenance alone reduced by US\$7 million per year
- Livelihoods improved: villagers harvest crabs and shrimps which live in mangroves
- Lesson: boosting sustainable disaster resilience requires a long-term, developmental approach


















Landuse map of Dai Hop Commune, Kien Thuy District Hai Phong Province
